

Secretary General participated in opening ceremony of 40th anniversary of IIUM

At the kind invitation of the management of the International Islamic University Malaysia, H.E. Prof. Dato Dr. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, Secretary General of the Academy, participated in the official opening ceremony for the fortieth anniversary of the University, on Saturday, 30 Shawal 1444H, corresponding to 20 May 2023, at its main campus in Gombak, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The event was organised under the patronage of **Her Majesty Seri Paduka Baginda The Raja Permaisuri Agong Tunku Azizah Aminah Maimunah Iskandariah binti Almarhum Al-Mutawakkil AIAllah Sultan Iskandar Al-Haj**, Consort of the King of Malaysia, and Constitutional Head of the University. The ceremony was opened with the recitation of the Holy Quran. Then Her Majesty delivered a speech on this occasion, which she described as the most crucial moment in the history of an university that has produced and continues to produce generations of distinguished leaders in various intellectual, scientific, religious, social, economic and political fields, praising what the university has done and continues to do through its programs of remarkable efforts and commendable work in the field of training generations. It is highly respected and appreciated what IIUM has accomplished during forty years of remarkable scientific achievements, whether at the local, regional, or international level. Her Majesty invited the university to move forward in improving its programs and to continue preparing a generation of young people who work to advance their society, help their people and contribute to building their homeland, and strengthen it with security, safety and stability. The opening speech was followed by a unique historical event: the awarding, for the first time in the history of the university, of an honorary doctorate to **His Majesty Seri Paduka Baginda The Yang Di-Pertuan Agong Al-Sultan Abdullah Ri'ayatuddin Al-Mustafa Billah Shah ibni Almarhum Sultan Haji Ahmad Shah Al-Musta'in Billah**,



King of Malaysia, in recognition of His Majesty's outstanding efforts in the field of reform and development, and in celebration of His Majesty's wisdom, deep sophistication, successful leadership and remarkable ability to resolve internal crises, as well as his well-known work in providing the means for a decent life, and his great care for parishioners at all levels. Prof Emeritus Tan Sri Dato Dzulkifli Bin Abdul Razak, rector of the university, gave an overview of His Majesty's biography, accompanied by commemorative photos of some of the milestones in His Majesty's life. The ceremony ended with a royal speech by His Majesty the King, in which he expressed his thanks to the university for granting him this honorary certificate, praising the vision, mission and achievements of the university over the past forty years, and emphasizing his pride in what the university has achieved during these four decades of giving, and called on the university's leaders to redouble their efforts to promote its mission and excellence. At the end of the ceremony, the university

Secretary General speaks on Sharia directives for protection of human rights in trade at 21st session of IPHRC



Within the framework of the 21st Session of the OIC Independent Standing Committee on Human Rights, which started on Sunday, 01 Dhul Quidah 1444, corresponding to 21 May 2023 at the Hilton Hotel in Jeddah, H.E. Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, Secretary General of the Academy, delivered a speech on the Islamic Perspective of Commercial Activities and the Role of Islamic Heritage in Preserving Rights and Human Rights. The following is an excerpt from His Excellency's speech: As a blessed Ummah, its early scholars and forefathers in the fields of belief, jurisprudence, principles and objectives, have left us this unifying legacy that contains everything that comes to mind, including solid foundations capable of directing financial and business calamities, addressing current developments in terms of gain and acquisition, and streamlining the forms and patterns that occur in contracts, obligations, rights and transactions. In reality, it is not a great effort or difficulty, but an assimilation of these principles, a digestion of these rules, and a commitment to the fundamentals and principles, away from all forms of betrayal. The role of our intellectual heritage in preserving rights, protecting property, encouraging productivity and celebrating creativity and innovation has been confirmed by our wise laws which consider the preservation of money as one of the legitimate objectives and five necessary interests (self, religion, offspring, money and reason) which all legislations have agreed on the need to preserve from any violation or arbitrariness; Moreover, the great law has linked the fulfillment of the commitment to a good set of acts of worship, such as zakat, awqaf, charity, wills, among others, to the necessity of its existence, availability, growth and stability. It is not surprising, therefore, that the rules that govern and control business are given special attention and a striking presence in the Qur'an and Sunnah as a guide, orientation and rationalization. It is also not surprising that these provisions include a security barrier and a good set of legal controls that make wealth and business a building block and one of the means to preserve human rights, especially the right to dignity and a decent life. These sharia controls prevent money from becoming a tool for sabotaging, eliminating or confiscating human rights. Doing business is part of the religion, like prayer, zakat, Hajj, and others, based on the word of the Almighty (Say: "Indeed, my prayer, my sacrificial rites, my life and my death are for Allah, the Lord of the worlds"); and because of the wisdom of

the noble Shari'ah, the texts contained in financial transactions are flexible texts that allow for Ijtihad and innovation in order to keep up with the developments and changes that occur in financial transactions in general and in business in particular. While Islam recognizes man's innate love for money and encourages him to seek it (It is He who has tamed the earth for you – so walk among its slopes and eat of its provisions – and to Him belongs the resurrection), it restricts this love and imposes controls on earning and owning money through business. Among the most important of these are: the pursuit of honesty and trustworthiness, which are considered two reasons for obtaining a blessing in money, and the honest and trustworthy merchant with the prophets, the truthful and the martyrs (both sellers have the option as long as they do not separate if they are honest and clear, they will be blessed in their sale, and if they conceal and lie, the blessing of their sale will be wiped out). Honest partners in the presence of God according to the Qudsi hadith: (I am the third of the two partners as long as one does not betray the other). In order to preserve these two important controls, the stern warning and the sure threat have been addressed to those who lie in financial transactions. Abu Dharr, may God be pleased with him, reported that the Prophet (peace be upon him) said, "There are three people to whom Allah will not speak



on the Day of Resurrection, will not look at them, and will not sanctify them, and their torment will be painful. The Messenger of Allah repeated and Abu Dharr said, "May they be lost and condemned." He added, "The one who lets his garment hang below his ankles, a salesman who tries to sell his goods by means of false oaths, and the one who reminds people of what he has given them." Among the important controls that the Shari'ah obliges one to observe in business affairs is that of avoiding cheating and deception, as it has been proved in the Sunnah that a man, peace and blessings be upon him, passed a patience of food and put his hand in it, so that his fingers got wet. He said, "What is this? What is this, O owner of the food? The Messenger of God, may the prayers and peace of God be upon him, said, "Why don't you put it on the table? Why don't you put it on top of the food so that people can see it because of our cheating, then it is not from us). Among the important controls that must be observed in commercial affairs is tolerance in transactions so that the seller does not



exaggerate in the goods and the buyer does not underestimate the price (may God have mercy on the man who is tolerant if he sells, if he buys, and if necessary), and among the important controls is that of keeping away from monopolization and not exploiting the needs of the people, especially during crises and disasters, monopolizing products and goods until they are no longer needed and the need arises, and then selling them at double prices. Moreover, it is not possible to list all the controls here. Therefore, we conclude by saying that our heritage is full of events and testimonies about the commitment of Muslim merchants to respect these controls in their business activities, which had a considerable impact on the spread of Islam and the call to Islam, as well as on the acceptance of non-Muslim societies to embrace it. As their words were consistent with their actions and behavior, they were role models in their dealings with others, especially in financial transactions, which had a positive effect on spreading the tolerance, moderation and justice of Islam on earth. On this basis, the Ummah is called upon today more than ever to clarify and care for these rights through collective Ijtihad, which is represented in the present era by its largest institution, the International Islamic Fiqh Academy, as an intellectual and scientific body comprising the eight schools of Islamic law followed by Muslims worldwide. Through seminars, conferences, workshops and forums aimed at raising awareness of the importance of adhering to Shariah controls in business. It is worth mentioning on this occasion that the Academy has taken an early interest in financial transactions, studying, investigating, rooting and clarifying them, studying their problems and discussing their recurring and evolving problems in order to guide and pay them so that they become free from the means of earning that confiscate human rights and infringe on his dignity, such as usury, fraud and monopoly. This great mission is evident in the resolutions and recommendations of the Academy which are considered a unanimous consensus in this era, and nearly one hundred (100) resolutions on various issues related to financial transactions to facilitate the activities of financial institutions and banks in the OIC Member States. In conclusion, we hope that this blessed session of the Commission will achieve its objectives.

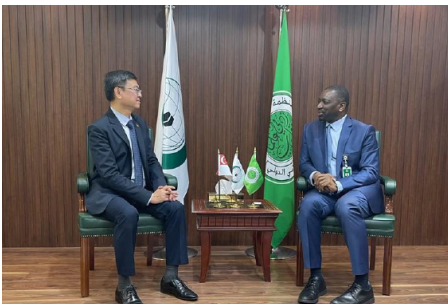

H.E. Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, Secretary General of the Academy, held a meeting on Wednesday, 4 Dhul Quidah 1444, corresponding to 24 May 2023, at the headquarters of the Secretariat General of the Academy with H.E. Ambassador Tariq Bakhit, Assistant Secretary General for Humanitarian, Cultural and Social Affairs of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation and his Special Envoy to Afghanistan, and with H.E. E. Ambassador Tariq Bakhit, Assistant Secretary General for

Humanitarian, Cultural and Social Affairs of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation and his Special Envoy to Afghanistan, and with H.E. Mr. Muhammad Saeed Al-Ayyash, Director General of the OIC Office in Kabul. The meeting was convened to discuss the final preparations for the upcoming visit of the Ummah scholars to Afghanistan to meet with representatives of the ruling authority. The purpose of this visit is to discuss with them the latest developments related to girls' education, women's participation

in progress, and the promotion of cooperation, communication and integration among all parts of the Afghan people. This meeting follows the resolutions of the Ministerial Council of Foreign Ministers of the OIC Member States at their recent conferences, which mandated the Academy to lead a delegation of scholars to visit Afghanistan. It should be noted that a delegation of scholars from the Ummah already visited Kabul last year and this visit is a continuation of the previous one. The meeting was attended by Mr. Mohamed Chouk, Director of Cabinet and Judicial Affairs, and Mr. Mohamed Al-Fihri, Director of Administrative and Financial Affairs.



Secretary General gives a lecture on need for humanities in Ijtihad and Ifta



H.E. Prof. Koutoub Moustpha Sano, Secretary General of the Academy, delivered a lecture on “The Need for Humanities in Ijtihad and Ifta in the Current Era”, in the first scientific session of the international symposium organized by the Foundation entitled “Teaching Human Sciences in Institutions of Religious Higher Education: The Present and the Future,” on Tuesday, 26 Shawal 1444, corresponding to 16 May 2023, at the institution’s headquarters in Rabat. He began his lecture by extending his sincere thanks and appreciation to those in charge of Dar Al-Hadith Al-Hasaniya Foundation for their warm welcome, and for their successful organization of this important scientific symposium in the present era, praising the importance of the topic and the necessity of multiplying similar seminars and conferences that aim of enhancing awareness of the importance of the humanities. He then spoke of the concepts of his lecture, in which he emphasized that “both Ijtihad and issuing fatwas have become an industry and a task that cannot be practiced by anyone. The scholars of Usul and Maqasid went on early in history with the codification of sciences to surround it with a solid fence of conditions and controls that prevent it from being compromised. Sometimes, with the tools of ijthad and fatwas at other times, and with the mechanisms of ijthad and fatwas at other times..” His Excellency then explained that the Sharia ruling has three pillars, which are the Lawgiver represented in the Quran and the Sunnah and the evidence that derives from them known as sub-evidence, or rational evidence, and the second pillar is meant by the person who is charged, and as for the third pillar, it is the one who is judged in it, and it means the act that is the subject of the assignment. His Excellency added, saying that the intended goal of diligence and fatwa is “to achieve a trustworthy link between the Revelation from the Sky and the reality on earth, and to enable man to carry out the duty of succession and prospering the universe,” which means that the subject of each of the two , ijthad and ifta, revolves around understanding the text (the revelation = the ruler), understanding the human being (= the one who is judged = the one charged), and understanding the reality (= the one who is judged or by it = the subject of the assignment), and that is for the sake of “ Ensuring human compliance with what was brought by the Revelation (= the sacred text), and ensuring the excitement of reality with its lofty teachings, in order to ward off the specter of conflict and contradiction between the text

and the human being on the one hand, and between the text and reality on the other hand. His Excellency pointed out that “the one who meditates on the tools and instruments considered by the former scholars of usul and maqasid as the most important conditions for practicing the industry finds most of them knowledge and sciences that enable the listener to understand the text with a rational and graceful understanding; As for those knowledge and sciences that enable him to understand man, they are sober and solid in parallel, we think that they did not receive the same proper care, nor that desired care, in order to root their foundations and liberate their contents, just as we think that the desired attention and the expected liberation of these knowledge and sciences that enable him to understand The reality that is intended to be adapted and subjugated to the will of the honorable Lawgiver has not yet obtained what it deserves in terms of rooting, analysis, and investigation. Therefore, we call from here, from the well-established Dar Al-Hadith Al-Hasaniyya Foundation, to the necessity of reconsidering the classification of the sciences and tools of ijthad and fatwas so that it becomes an objective, balanced and reliable classification. With the sciences and knowledge that helped to understand the sacred text as sciences and knowledge for Ijtihad and fatwas, and also relied on the sciences and knowledge that helped to understand man, and to understand reality in a sound, sober understanding that was no less deep and accurate than the previous



ones, and that was to ensure a safe and effective usage of the requirements and significance of the text that is fixed on man and the reality..” With regard to the first type of science and knowledge, it is represented by what is known as the legitimate sciences and knowledge, and the knowledge of the Arabic language as well, the knowledge of the roots of religion, the science of hadith, the science of jurisprudence, the science of difference = comparative jurisprudence, and the knowledge of purposes/maqasid. As for the second type of sciences and knowledge, it is represented in those sciences and knowledge that are labeled with human sciences and knowledge..”And he added that “enabling ijthad and issuing fatwas to bring about the desired and sustainable change in man and reality today requires mastering the basic principles that make up those sciences and knowledge, and also requires his saturation with the major theories that organize them, in addition to the need to supervise the curricula and the research tools in it that are equivalent to the methods of inference and deduction.” And he also added: “The implication of this proposed classification of the sciences and knowledge of the fiqh and fatwa is the need to overcome that

schizophrenia between religious sciences and human sciences, and the need to carry out a prudent and honest review of the curricula and courses so that they become curricula capable of preparing an empowered and balanced generation of scholars and thinkers who understand the sacred text (= revelation = Example) They are sober, and they understand the human being and the reality that affects him and is affected by him. Our basis for this call, is what the reader may find in many books and works that talked about the conditions of ijthad and issuance of fatwas, from the firm belief that their masters have knowledge of reality as one of the conditions of ijthad, and knowing people well is a condition of issuing fatwas. However, one does not find in the midst of that analysis and elaboration of those sciences and knowledge specific to these two knowledges. He then explained that “the predecessors have their excuse for not stating the sciences and knowledge called sciences and human knowledge within the sciences and knowledge of Sharia, given that these sciences and knowledge were not codified in their eras, which made it impossible to stipulate them at that time. For our current era, that excuse is no longer acceptable, because these knowledge and sciences are today written, available and facilitated for learning and furthering, which nullifies with it every excuse or reluctance to not stipulate them..” Therefore, today the human sciences should be relied upon as one of the conditions for ijthad and fatwas in our present era, as they are sciences that provide a reasonable explanation for the phenomena surrounding man in their various manifestations and formations, as they are available on specific research methods and tools for a good understanding of reality, and for an understanding of duty in reality without affectation; and of course, it goes without saying that it is not required of the one who practices ijthad and issuing fatwas to reach the degree of specialists in all the knowledge and sciences mentioned by the scholars of the Fiqh principles and maqasid, whether to know the text or to know the reality and know the human being, but it is sufficient for him to master the basic principles of them, and that is according to all of them sciences, instruments and means, not just sciences of purposes, as Ibn Khaldun pointed out in his introduction..” His Excellency concluded his lecture by stating that the need for human sciences by both the mujtahid and the mufti is considered one of the most important acts of worship, in order to achieve the objectives of his Ijtihad and fatwa, which is to achieve the predominance of religion over reality, and to guide life with the teachings of Sharia based on balance, coherence, harmony and stability.

His Excellency welcomed his honourable guest and the accompanying delegation, thanked him for his visit, expressed his thanks and appreciation to the Republic of Indonesia for its support to the Academy and its willingness to strengthen cooperation, communication and partnership, and reassured his guest of Indonesia's importance as the largest Muslim country in the world and a founding member of the Academy. IIFA participates in Experts Group Meeting on OIC Plan of Action on Disabilities



The Academy participated in the Intergovernmental Expert Group Meeting on the OIC Plan of Action on People with Disabilities, held in Jeddah, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, on 01 Dhul Qui'dah 1444, corresponding to June 21/2023, 22-. The Academy was represented by Ms Sara Amjad Bedwi, Director of Family, Women, Children, Elderly and Disabled, and Dr Alhagi Manta Drammeh, Head of International Cooperation and External Relations Division. Statements were made by the representative of the Islamic Republic of Mauritania as Chairman of the forty-ninth session of the Council of Foreign Ministers and the representative of Turkey as Chairman of the Ministerial Conference on Social Development respectively on the importance of the Action Plan to develop an action plan that will integrate people with disabilities in OIC

member countries at socio-cultural, educational and political levels. This was followed by a welcoming remark from the Secretariat General to get enriching feedback from delegates and representatives before finalizing the document or submitting it to the Ministerial meeting. The draft action plan was prepared by the Statistical, Economic and Social Research and Training Centre for Islamic Countries (SESRIC). The Action Plan includes an overview of the OIC Action Plan, highlighting the timeliness of this document to address the issues of inequality and challenges faced by people with disabilities, and to develop a comprehensive action plan to address these challenges in socio-economic life and increase their participation in the development of their societies and communities. It is hoped that the action plan will serve as a roadmap for policy-makers to coordinate efforts and share knowledge and experience between member states on improving the situation of people with disabilities in relation to international initiatives and the Sustainable Development Goals. The action plan also includes the general principles of diversity, life-course approach, inclusion, human dignity and multi-sectoral approach. The action plan stresses the many challenges faced by people with disabilities in OIC

countries, including weak institutions and insufficient financial resources. The plan focuses on social, economic, health and cultural challenges. Accordingly, the Action Plan outlines a number of areas for action, including education, health, economic integration, governance and the creation of an enabling environment, as well as the articulation of Islamic values that emphasize respect for diversity and inclusion. Following SESRIC's presentation of the Action Plan, representatives of member countries and OIC institutions made interventions and comments on various aspects of the project. The representatives of the Academy thanked the OIC General Secretariat for the kind invitation, reiterating the paramount importance of this Action Plan and expressing the Academy's willingness to work in collaboration with the OIC and its other institutions to implement the aforementioned Action Plan in its Strategic Plan when approved accordingly. The Academy delegation drew the attention of the honourable representatives to Resolution No. 213 (922/) issued by the Academy at its 22nd session held in Kuwait from 2 to 5 Jumada al-Akhirah 1436, corresponding to March 22/2015, 25- concerning the rights of people with disabilities in Islamic jurisprudence.

Secretary General speaks on Digital Assets at AAOIFI Conference in Manama



H.E. Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, Secretary General of the Academy, participated on Monday 18 Shawal 1444, corresponding to 8 May 2023, in a roundtable discussion on “Digital Assets and Islamic Banking”, which was part of the 21st AAOIFI Shariah Council Conference, recently held in Manama, Kingdom of Bahrain. His Excellency began his speech by defining what is meant by the term “digital assets” which refers to anything that can be stored and transmitted electronically via a computer or any other digital device, and which is linked to ownership or usage rights. In other words, assets, benefits and property rights stored in digital form. This perception applies to paintings, documents and photographs, as well as to what are now known as digital currencies of different types. His Excellency clarified the situation by stating “The Shariah ruling regarding these and other new transactions, whether a permissibility or a prohibition, must be based on the general texts of Shariah, its general maxims and objectives. The general principle is permissiveness, and the principle in transactions is particularly permissiveness, and the Sharia texts contained on transactions are flexible texts that allow for Ijtihad and Tajdid in every time and place. The concept of “wealth/maal” in Islam applies to goods, benefits and rights, and it also applies to digital goods, as they are not without being representative of goods, benefits

or rights, which means that the digitization is now considered to be one of God Almighty’s bounties and facilitations to us in our time, as it has now become one of the most important and effective means we use to preserve money and property, and no one can attack or control it without our permission, and until recently we used to carry our money and coins with us, then our paper money, and now, thank God, we don’t need to carry that money which has become stored in codes and forms in computers and wristwatches. This is why we should no longer talk about the legitimacy of these modern means, but rather about how to take advantage of them and enable them to achieve legitimate objectives in the field of transactions, by subjecting them to Sharia rulings and controls”. His Excellency went on to talk about the types of digital assets, explaining that they are divided into two types, namely, “Digital assets that represent real assets transformed into digital codes and forms, such as logos, paintings and other assets that are actually rights held by their owners, and rights are a type of money, and all other types of money apply to them.” The rulings on wealth in Islamic jurisprudence, and as for the second type of digital assets, these are digital currencies, particularly cryptocurrencies, which are the subject of continuous debate on their Sharia ruling in terms of permissiveness or prohibition.” His Excellency pointed out that there are three types of crypto-currency: “Firstly,

cryptocurrencies that are backed by local paper currencies such as the dollar, euro, dinar and riyal, and there is no dispute that their rulings is the same rulings as of the currencies they represent, and secondly, cryptocurrencies backed by precious commodities or metals, and there is also no legal divergence in the ruling of this first type; As for the third type, these are decentralized cryptocurrencies which are not subject to the jurisdiction of any government or state, and have today become a new means of exchanging benefits and a mediator for transactions.” His Excellency explained that



the position of Sharia ruling in this type of case requires the need to differentiate between currencies and their areas of use and circulation, and the fact that it is not subject to the jurisdiction of the ruler or official authorities does not mean that it is not subject to the will of a ruler, because the ruler has the right to set conditions and controls for its use or movement within the borders of his country, and each individual must comply with these rules, controls and conditions. The dialogue was moderated by H.E. Mr. Shaher Abbas, Founder of IFN and it was well received by the attendees who had a chance to interact with H.E. Sheikh Dr. Kahlan Al Kharusi, Assistant to the Grand Mufti of Oman, and H.E. Dr. Yusuf Sultan, Executive Director of Adli Corporation, who also participated in the conference.



Head of International Cooperation represents IIFA at OIC Expert Meeting for Protection of Cultural Heritage in Muslim World



H.E. Dr. Alhagi Manta Drammeh, Head of the International Cooperation and External Relations Division represented the Academy at the Intergovernmental Experts Group Meeting on the Establishment of an OIC Platform for the Protection and Preservation of Cultural Heritage in the Muslim World on 2627- Shawal 1444, corresponding to 1617- May 2023, at the Organization of Islamic Cooperation headquarters in Jeddah. The idea of protecting and preserving cultural heritage in OIC member states dates back to the 1980s, with the creation of the OIC Commission for the Preservation of Islamic

Cultural Heritage as a subsidiary body and the Research Centre for Islamic History, Art and Culture as an executive body. The session of this committee was later merged with that of IRCICA in 2000. The Council of Foreign Ministers held in Niger on November 27 and 28, 2020, in its resolution 1047-/C, requested the OIC Secretariat General to implement the resolution on the establishment of the OIC Platform in collaboration with the relevant OIC institutions. Accordingly, the May 16-17 meeting was convened to recommend the status, modalities, composition, scope, themes, tasks and operation of the platform. The opening session began with remarks from the representatives of the Foreign Session of the Council of Islamic Ministers, who welcomed the representatives of OIC member countries and representatives of OIC institutions. The IRCICA representative spoke of the project progress to create the platform and the consultations that had

led to the preparation of the action plan. The ICESCO representative spoke of the important role of its Heritage Centre. Furthermore, IRCICA Secretariat General spoke about the legal basis for the creation of the platform, including the resolutions of the ministers and summits and the results of the workshops and conferences, held in 2017 and 2019 respectively. Several interventions were made by representatives to enrich the report before its submission to the Council of Foreign Ministers meeting to be held in Cairo in June 2023. The representative of the International Islamic Fiqh Academy conveyed the best regards of the Academy’s Secretary General to the participants, appreciating the idea of establishing the Platform, and thus transmitted the Academy’s willingness to contribute to the establishment of such a platform from a Sharia point of view, being the main reference in the matter.

The objective of this specialized course was to develop participants' skills in preparing and writing content for social media accounts for official institutions based on media and linguistic considerations and to manage them effectively, in addition to acquiring the necessary skills in preparing content for social media accounts, as well as the mechanisms of persuasion (linguistic and non-linguistic), and how to improve editing social media content. 99th Weekly Meeting of Departments



H.E. Prof. Dr. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, Secretary General of the Academy, chaired the ninety-ninth weekly meeting of the departments on Monday 11 Shawal 1444 corresponding to 1st May 2023. He opened the meeting by extending his congratulations on the occasion of Eid Al-Fitr, asking the Lord to bless everyone's fasting, prayers and good deeds and to return it to us and the Ummah in the best of returns, and may He grant security and prosperity to our Ummah. He expressed his condolences on Professor Abdulwahab Abu Suleiman, former member of the Council of Senior Scholars and Academy member, who passed away on the 26th Ramadan 1444, corresponding to 17th April 2023, after a scholarly career rich in knowledge. He then talked about his official visit to the Republic of Iraq aimed at strengthening the relations of cooperation and integration with

The meeting discussed the decisions issued by the previous meeting, and several new decisions were issued, notably:
