Afghan Deputy PM for Political Affairs welcomes Ummah's Scholars in Kabul

H.E. Mr. Mawlawi Abdulkabir, Deputy Prime Minister for Political Affairs of the Afghanistan's ruling authority, welcomed the delegation of Ummah's scholars visiting Afghanistan, led by the IIFA, on Friday 15 Safar 1445, corresponding to 1 September 2023 in Kabul. He stressed that education, in its religious and secular aspects, and at all levels and in all fields, is a sacred right for women and men, and that enabling them to



receive education is a responsibility for the family, society and the state towards both boys and girls. Indeed, this is one of the great responsibilities that fathers and mothers, society and the state will have to assume. Consequently, the scholars of the Ummah call on the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan to do everything in its power to enable girls to return to schools and universities as soon as possible to continue their education in all available fields and useful sciences, from medicine, architecture, nursing to mathematics, physics and chemistry explaining that "the sciences and knowledge with which women and men must be endowed with include the religious sciences and the mundane sciences, and it is not permissible to deprive them of any type of science". Indeed, Shariah has not made any distinction between the sciences when it has ordered them to be sought and acquired in

education, both religious and secular, at all

the authentic hadiths: "Seeking knowledge is an obligation for every Muslim. The Prophet therefore made no distinction between men and women, nor between levels of education, and it is therefore not permissible to differentiate between them, nor is it permissible to deprive men or women of them, especially as the Afghan Muslim community's need for science is greater than ever, because of the difficult circumstances it has experienced over the past forty years of war. H.E. concluded his speech by underlining the willingness of OIC member states to allow the ruling authority to benefit from its experience and expertise in the field of women's education. The floor was also given to the comments by eminent scholars, all of whom stressed the importance of increasing efforts to enable Afghan girls and boys to receive education, both religious and mundane. At the end, the Deputy Prime Minister hosted the delegation for a dinner in their honor.



Afghan Minister of Justice receives Ummah's Scholars at the Ministry



H.E. Mullah Abdulhakim Shari, Minister of Justice of the current Afghan authority, received a delegation of the Ummah's scholars on Saturday, Safar 16, 1445, corresponding to September 2, 2023, at the Ministry's headquarters in Kabul. He thanked the delegation of scholars for this second visit to Afghanistan and praised the delegation's concerns with the Afghan people and their desire for stability, progress and development. For his part, H.E. Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, head of the delegation, expressed their sincere appreciation to the Afghan authority for its generous hospitality. He also commended the achievements and changes Afghanistan has witnessed over the past two years, noting also the authority's wise decision to open religious schools at all levels for girls. Then he expressed the delegation's satisfaction at seeing girls and boys strolling through the streets of Kabul, their schoolbags on their backs. He concluded his speech by stressing the importance of enabling girls to receive

stages and in all fields, bearing in mind that education in Islam, both religious and secular, is a sacred legal right for girls and boys. It is not permissible for anyone to deprive anyone of any of its types as long as beneficial. In fact, enabling both girls and boys to acquire education and endowing women and men with useful sciences is one of the great responsibilities that fathers and mothers, society and the state will have to assume on the Day of Judgment. Therefore, the scholars of the Ummah around the world call upon the responsible authorities of the Emirate to allow girls to return to their studies in schools and universities as soon as possible, in order to continue their education and qualification in all fields of education that the Afghan people need, including medicine, engineering, architecture, nursing etc. and other useful sciences. This is due to the fact that "the sciences and knowledge with which women and men must be endowed include the religious sciences and the sciences of the world, and it is not permissible to deprive them of any type of science, for Shariah has not made any distinction between the sciences when it commanded it to be sought and acquired, according the authentic hadiths": "It has not differentiated between men and women, nor between levels of education, and so it is not permissible to differentiate between them,

nor to deprive a woman or a man of them, especially as the Afghan Muslim community is increasingly in need of the world's sciences, due to the difficult circumstances it has experienced over the past forty years of war. He then concluded by underlining the willingness of OIC member states to allow the ruling authority to benefit from their experience in the field of women's education. The floor was given over to the eminent scholars, all of whom stressed the importance of redoubling efforts to enable Afghan girls to receive education, both religious and worldly, and at all levels. The Minister appealed to the delegation to reassure the Muslim world about the situation of the Afghan people and the urgent need to stand by them and provide support to this people and also asked the delegation to work towards the reopening diplomatic missions in Kabul.



Afghan Interior Minister welcomes Ummah's Scholars in Kabul

H.E. Mullah Sirajuddin Haqqani, Deputy of the Amir of Faithful and Minister of the Interior of the current authority in Afghanistan, received the delegation of Ummah scholars on Monday afternoon, Safar 18, 1445, corresponding to September 4, 2023, at the Intercontinental Hotel in Kabul. He asked the Minister to continue his efforts to enable girls to receive education in scientific subjects alongside religious subjects, and to enable girls to resume their studies at universities and colleges in accordance with the legal and ethical guidelines established by the Emirate. The floor was then given to their Eminences the members of the delegation, who

stressed the importance of education, both religious and worldly, for women and men. For his part, H.E the Minister welcomed the delegation of Ummah's scholars and expressed his sincere thanks for this second visit, which confirms the Emirate's confidence in the Ummah scholars who stand by the Afghan people and authorities, and their concern for the Emirate's future. He stressed that instead of talking about the Emirate's achievements, which the delegation had already seen, or talking about women's education, about which His Excellency and the delegation were already on the same page, he therefore addressed the delegation with a number of practical proposals that the delegation would like to see realized, stressing that there is total belief in the fact that worldly and religious education is compulsory for every Muslim man and woman, and that it is a sacred right of both men and women. He thanked the delegation once gain hoping to see them in a few months rather than after a whole year.



Afghan Foreign Minister receives Ummah's Scholars at the Ministry in Kabul



H.E. Mr. Mawlawi Amir Khan Muttaqi, Minister of Foreign Affairs of the ruling authority in Afghanistan, received the delegation of Ummah's scholars visiting Afghanistan on the evening of Thursday 14 Safar 1445, corresponding to August 31, 2023, at the Ministry's headquarters in Kabul. He welcomed the delegation and thanked them for this visit, which follows on from the first visit the delegation made a year ago , expressing his delight at the delegation's arrival at a time when the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan is experiencing developments, significant and rapid changes at various levels, notably with regard to the security situation, which has become unprecedented, and the economic situation, which is also seeing significant improvement thanks to judicious policies, the most important of which are the fight against corruption, the rationalization of spending and the diversification of revenue sources, as well as the Emirate's efforts in

Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano Koutoub Moustapha Sano, head of the delegation, thanked the authority for warm welcome, praising the developments the delegation had seen since their arrival in Kabul at the security and economic levels. He praised the efforts of the ruling authority in the fight against corruption and drugs, and expressed the delegation's satisfaction with the decision to open religious schools at all levels for girls, He underlined the latter's great aspiration to continue its efforts and hard work to give girls and boys access to education, both religious and secular, at all levels and in all fields of knowledge, "because the Ummah in general and the Afghan people in particular are today in urgent need of a significant number of women doctors, nurses, engineers, physicists, chemists, mathematicians and experts in all fields of the human, social and natural sciences to combat poverty, ignorance and disease"." He also explained that "in Islam, science

and knowledge are complementary and not mutually exclusive, and that the Muslim community needs all the beneficial and useful sciences, and that the command to seek knowledge according to the hadith, 'Seeking knowledge is obligatory upon every Muslim', does not differentiate between the sciences, meaning that seeking knowledge has both religious and worldly aspects. Indeed, learning is considered a sacred right for both boys and girls, and it is not permissible for a girl or a boy to be deprived of it. He then concluded his speech by calling on the authority to consider the possibility of benefiting from the experience and expertise of OIC member states in the field of girls' education. Speeches were then given by the delegation's scholars, who all stressed the importance of paying attention to the education of girls and boys and enabling them to pursue religious and secular studies at all levels. At the end of the meeting, His Excellency the Minister invited the delegation to dinner, which the Ministry had prepared in their honor.



Ummah's Scholars meet Afghan Minister of Petroleum and Minerals in Kabul

H.E. Sheikh Mawlawi Shihab al-Din Dilawar, Minister of Petroleum and Mines, one of the most prominent scholars in Afghanstan, met the delegation of the Ummah's scholars at the residence of the delegation, on Sunday 17 Safar 1445, corresponding to September 3, 2023. The meeting began with a recitation of the Holy Qur'an, after which H.E. the Minister expressed the Islamic Emirate's great appreciation for the delegation's visit, thanking them for their second visit, which is proof of their concern for the Emirate's future. He spoke of the emirate's achievements over the past two years in various fields, the most important of which minerals, explaining that the ministry he oversees has been able to sign a number of contracts and agreements with local, regional and international companies specializing in gas, oil and the exploration of gold, copper, zinc, iron and precious stones. Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, head of the delegation, thanked the autority for the generosity and warm welcome, praising the success of the current authority in ensuring security and safety in all provinces of the country, and congratulating the Minister on the remarkable achievements of his Ministry under his wise leadership, noting that the future is promising due to the contracts and agreements concluded by the Ministry recently. However, He stressed that the natural resources that abound in Afghanistan's rich lands can only be exploited to the full if

Afghan children are given the means to obtain education, both religious and worldly and at all levels, in accordance with Sharia law, which stipulates that education is a legitimate and sacred right shared by everyone, men and women alike. It is therefore not permissible, according to the Sharia, to make a distinction between men and women with regard to this right, just as it is not permissible to make a distinction between the religious sciences and the worldly sciences, for all are required and necessary, as the Minister knows better, in his capacity as a great scholar of the sciences of hadith and jurisprudence. He concluded by stressing that the delegation wishes the Afghan authority to add scientific subjects alongside religious ones in the schools that had been opened. Also expressed its eagerness to see girls enrolled in universities and schools to pursue their studies in all available fields.



Ummah's scholars hold a discussion with Afghan Minister of Hajj and Guidance in Kabul



The Ummah's scholars met with H.E. Sheikh Mawlawi Muhammad Noor Saqib, former President of the Supreme Court and currently Minister of Hajj, Awqaf and Guidance, on Sunday 17 Safar 1445, corresponding to 3 September 2023, in Kabul. H.E. Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, head of the delegation, expressed the delegation's warm welcome the Afghan authorities' decision to open religious schools at all levels for girls. He also explained that the delegation was looking forward to seeing female students resume their studies at university in the field of medicine, architecture, physics, mathematics, chemistry and biology alongside Islamic sciences, as education whether religious or mundane is a sacred right for women and men. He affirmed the delegation's confidence in the Honourable Minister to play this noble role of advice and guidance, considering the Minister's scientific and professional position and solid experience in religious and world sciences. He pointed out that the suspension of girls'

studies because of mixing or not wearing the hijab can be easily resolved by an educational system that is based on the separation of girls and boys, where boys' and girls' schools are separated. Further he called on the Afghan authorities to benefit from the experience of OIC member states in the field of educational programs that combine religious and worldly subjects, noting that discrimination between religious and worldly sciences as the Ummah needs not only religious scholars, but also scientists in worldly subjects. Accordingly, the scholars of the Ummah call on the current Afghan authorities to speed up the opening of universities to girls, and to teach scientific subjects alongside religious ones in schools, so that the Afghan people can prepare a fully-fledged generation capable of reforming the universe and achieving happiness in this world and the hereafter. For his part, H.E. the Minister expressed the Islamic Emirate's great appreciation at the visit of the delegation of scholars which confirmed the solidarity of the Ummah's scholars with Afghan people. He then provided the delegation with further information on the Emirate's achievements over the past two years in the areas of security, economy, and education. He also spoke of the difficulties and challenges facing the Afghan authority in various fields, particularly in education, given that the invaders have tried over several decades of occupation to brainwash

the Afghan people into atheism and revolt against noble values and customs. This is why the Afghan authorities have temporarily suspended studies for girls in order to prepare the atmosphere and develop programs that adhere to Islamic values and Afghan customs. He also expressed the delegation's satisfaction with what it had heard and seen concerning the country's security and economy, as well as the Afghan government's intention to reopen schools and universities for men and women as soon as the new textbooks have been printed. On this occasion, His Excellency called on the authorities to make maximum use of the programs and practical experiences in female education in force in certain OIC member states, such as the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, as they have enabled males and females to receive education, both religious and secular, at all levels, while adhering to the values and principles of Sharia. His Excellency stressed that the OIC is fully

prepared to mobilize the support of its member states to print the curricula and help ease the burden on the Afghan government with regard to teachers' salaries. Consequently, the delegation of scholars calls on the authorities to allow girls and women to receive education, both religious and secular, and at all levels, just like boys and men, stressing that this is a matter of trust on the shoulders of the authority, "because education, both religious and secular, and at all its stages, is considered a sacred and legal right for women and men, and a great duty imposed by God on the family, society and the state, and it is not permissible in sharia to deprive a woman or a man of any kind of science". The participating scholars, both men and women, then delivered a speech in which they called on the authorities to allow Afghan males and females to receive education, both religious and secular, and at all levels. At the end of the meeting, the Chairman of the Afghan Red Crescent assured the delegation that their appeal would reach the leader of the Islamic Emirate, hoping for a further meeting with the scholars in times to come.



Ummah's Scholars hold a discussion with Afghan Minister of Education in Kabul

H.E. Mawlawi Habibullah Agha, Minister of Education, met the delegation of the scholars on Tuesday, Safar 19, 1445, corresponding to September 5, 2023, at the delegation's residence in Kabul. H.E. Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, head of the delegation, thanked the authority for the warm welcome and expressed the feelings of joy that the delegation felt when they saw primary and high school girls walking the streets of Kabul carrying schoolbags. He added: "these feelings would be greater when they will see Afghan girls also crossing the streets with their younger sisters, to get to their universities, access to which they have been denied. certainly, it is a duty of the family, society and the state towards children, male and female, and that no one, whoever he may be, can deprive a girl or a boy of any kind of education, nor is it permissible, according to Sharia law, to give preference or differentiation between girls and boys with regard to this innate human right." He then pointed out that the Ministry of Education has great responsibility to enable Afghan girls to receive education at all levels, stressing that both religious and worldly education are compulsory and that there is no difference between them, because the purpose of education is to enable the learner to acquire the knowledge, skills and values that will help him or her to worship God, develop the



universe and achieve happiness in this world and the hereafter, and this goal can only be achieved with both types of education. This is why it is the duty of this blessed ministry to advise the Commander of the Faithful, to urge him to achieve these reforms. Therefore: "The scholars of the Ummah ask Your Excellency to convey to the Amir of the Faithful their thanks for opening religious schools for girls throughout the country. They hope that this decision will be followed by a decision stipulating the need to teach scientific subjects alongside religious subjects in these schools." The scholars reminded the importance of religious and worldly sciences, as well as the importance of empowering girls and stressed that there is no valid legal evidence in the Qur'an and Sunnah that discriminates between men and women with regard to their right to education, both religious and worldly. For his part, H.E. the Minister thanked the delegation of scholars for highlighting a

number of efforts his Ministry continues to make to enable all the sons and daughters of Afghanistan to receive education both religious and worldly, and stressing that work is underway to review the curricula left behind by the occupying forces in order to purify them of ideas that oppose the values and teachings of Islam, as well as Afghan customs and traditions. He stressed that the Ministry had completed the preparation of curricula for the primary and intermediate levels, and would soon complete the secondary level, and noted in this regard the Ministry's need of support of Islamic countries in printing new curricula, renovating educational institutions and building schools in remote areas to enable children from all regions to have access to education throughout the country. he spoke about the Ministry's efforts to eliminate all the obstacles and difficulties it faces, reiterating the appeal to the Islamic world to support the emirate and help bear the costs of printing, and provide means of transport.

The Ummah's scholars concluded their visit to Afghanistan on Tuesday 19 Safar 1445, corresponding to September 5, 2023, with a meeting with H.E. Mullah Nada Muhammad Nadeem, Minister of Higher Education at the Ministry's headquarters in Kabul. H.E. Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, head of the delegation, expressed the delegation's sincere thanks to the Afghan authorities for the hospitality and stressed that meeting with the Minister responsible for intellectual security and the preservation of the values is one of the main purpose of the delegation's visit aiming to fulfiling the duty of giving advice on the importance of girls' education. "Your Excellency, the scholars of the Ummah appeal to the Amir and his government, through your Ministry, to enable the girls of Afghanistan to receive education, both religious and worldly, at all levels. They are appealing appeal to give the much desired order to reopen the doors of universities to girls who have been deprived of continuing their studies, thus for every day that an Afghan girl is deprived of religious for every Muslim who has an atom of faith in his heart, and every day that passes for an Afghan girl deprived of returning to study in universities, that day is considered a horrible day for those love Afghanistan. Therefore, the scholars of the Ummah hold Your Excellency responsible for conveying this call to him, and they also hold your Excellency responsible for continuing to provide faithful guidance to the Amir in your capacity as a virtuous adviser in the field of education." Then he concluded by saying that he had felt deep sadness yesterday after reading the high school results in Afghanistan, which did not include the name of any girl!: "This means that this year, no girls will be entering university. It will certainly be a sad academic year, therefore we hope that you, will do everything possible to resolve this problem as soon as possible so that our girls can obtain secondary certificates that will enable them to continue their studies at universities and colleges in all the specializations that dear Afghan society needs. My brother, Your Excellency, the delegation of scholars believes that the reasons given for suspending girls' studies at universities can all be resolved easily and without the need for a long wait, by adopting a system of separation between higher education institutions for girls and higher education institutions for boys, as is the case in a number of Muslim countries.

As for the issue of curricula, revision should not require much time, particularly with regard to purely scientific specializations." For his part, the Minister expressed his sincere thanks to the delegation of scholars for visiting the emirate to check on their brothers, and stressed that he welcome all the valuable advice offered by the delegation, as he is convinced that they are sincere fraternal advice issued by scholars who wish good and prosperity for Afghanistan. He then addressed the issue of the suspension of girls' studies in universities, attributing this situation to logistical difficulties and the quality of the infrastructure, in terms of the curricular that is not compatible with the vision of the Emirates stressing that the Emirate fully believes in the right of girls to study in universities and colleges. He then confirmed that a committee was working on revising the curricula, and that once they are completed and logistical requirements met, girls would resume their studies at universities and colleges.



Ummah's Scholars visit Afghan Academy of Sciences in Kabul

His Eminence Sheikh Farid al-Din Mahmoud, President of the Afghan Academy of Sciences, received the delegation of scholars of the Ummah, on Monday 18 Safar 1445, corresponding to September 4, 2023, at the Academy's headquarters. H.E. Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, head of the delegation, expressed the delegation's thanks to the Afghan authority for its warm welcome, praising the role of the Afghan Academy in disseminating knowledge and science, and supporting scientific research, and hoping that this Academy will play a central role in raising society's awareness of the importance of education, then he said: "If the jihad waged by the Afghan people for forty-five years was a jihad in defence of honour and homeland, the expected jihad that the Afghan people should undertake now is a constructive and reconstructive jihad aimed at fighting ignorance, poverty and diseases. This jihad is considered to be one of the most honorable types of jihad, and one of the most difficult, so it must be waged in order to preserve the emirate's achievements and enable the Afghan people to benefit from its abundant natural resources". He declared that enabling

Afghan girls and boys to receive education is a religious and legitimate duty, as education is a sacred legal right, and the Ummah has been unanimous in its obligation since the time of the Sahaba. Accordingly, the delegation of scholars called on the President of the Academy to be their messenger to the current authorities to reopen universities and schools



to enable girls to continue their studies, while stressing that the OIC is ready to provide the logistical and technical support the authorities need to facilitate the return of girls to school. For his part, the President said that the Academy thanked the delegation for its visit and for its support for the Afghan people. He then provided the delegation with detailed information on what the Afghan people have been exposed to over the past four decades,



including the types of persecution, injustice and oppression, and the attempts by the forces of occupation to eliminate Afghan Islamic identity and its glorious history, and to replace Islam and Afghan culture with atheism and decadence. He also detailed the attempts of the occupying forces to interfere in the affairs of Afghanistan through their agents from within and without, stressing that the current authority will remain steadfast in the face of all attempts to obliterate Afghan identity. With regard to the education of girls. He stressed that the authorities firmly believe in their right to education, but are still working on revising curricula and finding solutions to the difficulties they face in this area. He therefore appealed to the delegation of scholars to stand by the Afghan people, offering support and assistance in this area.

Ummah's Scholars meet with UN Agencies based in Kabul



The delegation of Ummah scholars met with a number of UN agencies working in Afghanistan on the evening of Thursday 14 Safar 1445, corresponding to August 31, 2023, at the delegation's residence in Kabul. H.E. Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, head of the delegation, welcomed ladies and gentlemen who oversee the various international humanitarian agencies active in Afghanistan, praising their efforts to bring support to the Afghan people, noting the importance of coordinating efforts on a number of vitally important issues such as women's education, women's rights and minority participation. For his part, Ambassador Takashi Wakada, Japanese Ambassador to Afghanistan, welcomed the delegation and thanked them for their visit, praising the good results achieved during the first visit, and expressed his wish to see the delegation contribute to the development of the school curricula that the ruling authority is considering adopting, so that these curricula are not limited to religious subjects. He expressed his confidence in the delegation's ability to persuade the governing authority to resolve the above three issues wisely and competently. Then, H.E. Mr. Daniel Andres, Deputy Special Envoy of the UnderSecretary General for Humanitarian Affairs in Afghanistan, underlined the concern of all UN agencies to coordinate efforts and integrate measures to provide the support, aid and assistance that some twenty million Afghans need daily in terms of food and medicine, noting the scarcity of resources, in order to avoid the emergence of new humanitarian crises similar to those

in Ukraine and other countries in turmoil. He expressed confidence in the delegation's ability to persuade the governing authority to tackle the outstanding issues raised by the Japanese ambassador as soon as possible. He also pointed out that there had been a marked improvement in the security situation, which had become stable, and that most officials resident in Kabul were clearly open to the education of girls. He also pointed out that women's work is developing, since the ruling authority has approved their work in the fields of health, agriculture, commerce and education, and that with the exception of these areas, there is still work to be done due to logistical and customary considerations. At the end of the meeting, he expressed his sincere thanks to the agencies for their continued support to the Afghan people, underlining the commitment of the OIC and the Academy to resolving all the problems and issues raised by the agencies in the near future.



He stressed that cyberspace, with all its components, is considered a type of means whose rule is determined by the rule of purposes. It is also considered a doubleedged sword, and therefore we must use it and harness its potential to serve religion, society, the Ummah, and the world. We must be

that are attributed to Sharia. This discourse is in dire need of making the most of cyberspace, as it is one of the most influential in the current era. H.E. Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, Secretary General of the Academy, concluded his speech by stressing that responsible behavior with cyberspace, with its networks, and its renewable, expanding and developing means, should start from three basic foundations, which are realighnment, guidance, and rationalization. As for realighnment, it means building on the benefits and interests contained in cyberspace, and correcting the evils and dangers it may contain so that it becomes an effective means from which the moderate religious discourse will benefit. We aim to employ this cyberspace in a direction that brings benefit, goodness, and righteousness to the individual, society, the Ummah, and the world far and wide, away from any harmful usage that would spread extremism, fanaticism, militancy, and terrorism. As for rationalization of the cyberspace, it means enabling young people to comprehend the cyberspace in a deep and accurate manner, so that their dealings with it become rational, based on distinguishing between its benefits and harms, with a comprehensive and conscious understanding of how to employ it in religious discourse, in time and place. Hence, invoking these three foundations in using cyberspace to serve religious discourse makes it the wisdom that is the believer's lost treasure, wherever he finds it, he should benefit from it. It is worth mentioning that this annual international conference, organized the Ministry of Awqaf through the Supreme Council for Islamic Affairs, has recently witnessed a remarkable leap in the topics and issues it discusses since H.E. Prof Mohamed Mokhtar Gomaa, assumed the position of Minister of Awqaf. H.E. Prof. Sano described him in his speech as someone who follows up with skill and ability on all the developments and changes that digital world brings about, which has made his ministry a developed, witnessing, up-to-date and ministry.

On the sidelines of the seventy-eighth session of the United Nations General Assembly and in cooperation with the Islamic Cooperation Youth Forum, the Religions for Peace, and the International Islamic Figh Academy, His Excellency Prof. Koutoub Moustafa Sano, Secretary General of the Academy, participated on Thursday, 6 of Rabi' al-Awwal 1445, corresponding to September 21, 2023, in an intellectual discussion entitled: "Engaging Youth in Abolishing All Forms of Racism from a Religious Perspective to Achieve a Sustainable Future for All". In his intervention, His Excellency congratulated His Excellency Mr. Taha Ihan, President of the Islamic Youth Forum, and His Excellency the Associate Secretary General of the Religions for Peace Organization, for organizing this symposium in New York, expressing his regret for the lack of actual attendance, and stressing the Academy's keenness to participate in all events, meetings

and intellectual symposiums. This is based on his belief in the importance of correcting stereotypical notions about Islam's position on many contemporary issues. shedding light on the immortal contributions of Islam and Muslims to building civilization, advancing human beings, and rejecting violence, hatred, and intolerance and extremism in all its forms and sources. He noted that racism represents one of the social diseases that must be combated and be considered a major crime and a blatant attack on people. He explained that Islam views people as equal like the teeth of a comb, and that black has no superiority over red, nor has red over black, nor has an Arab over non-Arab, and nor has a non-Arab over an Arab, and that people differ in their deeds and what they can deliver to their communities. Then His Excellency pointed out that involving young people in such intellectual seminars is necessary and important to enable them

to know the position of all religions on racism, as it is an incurable disease and an unforgivable crime, he added, "It is From the first day of the mission of the Messenger of Islam, Muhammad bin Abdullah, may God bless him and his family, he waged a fierce war on racism, fanaticism, and violence, and established eternal teachings and solid systems that eliminated all forms of racism, slavery, and tyranny, and Islam made equality among people a permanent principle and eternal until the end of the world, because all people are born free, and it is not permissible to enslave them or discriminate against them. He concluded his intervention by calling on the United Nations to classify racism as one of the heinous crimes against humanity, and to reject all forms and images of Racism, and the need to prosecute anyone who practices it, or is involved in any form of it. He also called on scholars, especially young people, followers of all religions, to join efforts, coordinate and cooperate in order to make this dream a tangible reality, because racism is not a less crime and less heinous than the crimes of murder, rape and atrocities, which requires combating them by all means in order to achieve harmony and peace between peoples and nations on the basis of love, respect, integration, cooperation, and solidarity in all matters for the benefit and goodness of the whole world.



34th Monthly Staff Meeting

Prof. Koutoub Moustapha Sano, Secretary General of the Academy, chaired the thirtyfourth monthly meeting of the Academy's employees, on Sunday 03 Rabi' al-Awal 1445, corresponding to September 17, 2023, at the headquarters of the Secretariat General in Jeddah. At the beginning of the meeting, His Excellency welcomed the attendees, thanked them for participating in the meeting, and spoke about the importance of these meetings in coordinating, completing, and following up on the team work. His Excellency also spoke about the necessity of reviewing what has been accomplished and what has not been accomplished during the past three years, and knowing the obstacles and their causes, and the impediments to achieve it. - Sending a copy of the Academy's magazine and any available publications from the Academy to the delegation of scholars that visited Afghanistan, and some universities in Afghanistan, Pakistan, Malaysia, Brunei, Indonesia, Niger, Nigeria, Guinea, Kuwait, Qatar, and other universities.
- Delivering annual reports to employees in a timely manner, and the importance of managers seeking justice, fairness, fear of God when preparing such report.
